The Compiled Laws of Utah for 1878 gives an account of the incorporation of Silver Reef by the Legislative Assembly; however, this incorporation never actually became law and the town was never incorporated. 33 Another attempt was later made which failed also because the mining companies and business men who feared taxation opposed the movement. 34 Town officials were Deputy Sheriff Joseph Hoag who was the town constable during most of its active history (he handled with outstanding courage the many problems which arose) and Justices of the Peace Kiv Phillips, Benjamin Paddock and J. N. Louder.
