	(Her future husband, Jesse Stone was born shortly before on July 13, 1842 in Duplain, Michigan, not to far away), and he was also involved in the Civil war. Somehow he met, Nettie.
1866:	29 Nov. Nettie and Jesse Eugene Stone married at Caledonia, Kent Co. Michigan:
	Jessie Eugene Stone married Nettie Emma Van Tine born in Atlas, Michigan, 12 Nov. 1846, dau. Of Charles and Abigail (Brown) Van Tine, 29 Nov. 1866 at Caledonia, Michigan. (Marriage record)
1866:	Stone, J.E., resided Duplain, and Nettie E. Vantine, resided Corunna, marriage license/date was Nov.29/1866 at Corunna.  (Abstracts from Marriages in Clinton County, Mich by genealogists (1863-1900) online)
1866:	Dec 7: the newspaper, "Clinton Republican" on Page 1, stated the following: <b>MARRIED:</b>
	Stone –Vantine – At Corunna, on the 29 <sup>th</sup> , by the Rev. E.E. Gregory, Mr. I.E. Stone of Duplain, Clinton County and Miss Nettie E. Vantine, of Corunna.
1869:	4May <b>NELLIE M. STONE</b> born; Olive, Michigan. (Possibly May 4, 1871; Duplain, Mich.)
1870:	CENSUS:  Jesse Stone – residing in Olive Twp, Clinton County on Page 565R - copy unreadable.
1870:	During this year, the family sold their home in Olive, and moved to Duplain. It was here they purchased a farm of 120 acres.

## Mrs. Nettie E. Stone

Mrs. Nettie E. Stone, a resident of St. Johns for the last 30 years passed away at the home of her son, Frank E. Stone. 308 State street east. Friday. April 6, in her eightieth year. Mrs. Stone's maiden name was Van Tine and she was born in Genessee county, Mich., November 12, 1843. She attended the city school at Corunna, graduating from its high school department and later engaged in teaching. On November 29, 1865, she was married to Jesse E. Stone at Corunna, after which she moved with her husband to a farm in Duplain township, Clinton county, where they resided until 1893, when they moved to St. Johns. Three children were born to Mr. and Mrs. Stone, Nettie and Marcus, deceased, and Frank E. of this city.

Mrs. Stone was a woman of an exceptionally bright mind, having strong religious convictions. Early in life she united with the Presbyterian church and became very active in its missionary work. On moving to St. John's she united with the Congregational church, in which she remained a member up to her death. She was a Member of the Eastern Star, Woman's Relief Corps and Woman's club and often contributed articles of merit at their gatherings.

Funeral services were held Sunday, at 1;00 o'clock at the home of her son, the Rev. H. A.. Blanning officiating, and interment was made in Mt. Rest Cemetery.
